# **Training Notes**

- All Training to be conducted with the Cessna 208B **OR** the Daher TBM-930. This is at the instructor's discretion.
- All training to be completed with an instructor of rank Lieutenant or higher.
- All training flights to be logged on VAM, with the mission quoted as "BASIC1" (number appropriate to mission).
- Pilot MUST be entered onto VAM BEFORE beginning training.

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# Mission 1 – Acquaintance

Location: KNXP (Twentyninepalms)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

Est. completion time: 0:20

### **MISSION BRIEFING**

Pilot to begin flight with instructor at Twentyninepalms. All UNICOM must be used, pilot is to taxi to active runway and complete **three** touch-and-goes.

Instructor to ensure completed to satisfactory standard.

## Mission 2 – Planning

Location: KNXP (Twentyninepalms)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

Est. completion time: 1:00 (inc. planning time)

#### **MISSION BRIEFING**

Pilot to complete planning sheet (available under #documents). Flight originating KNXP, arriving KPSP. Route is at pilot's discretion but FPL must be filed.

Pilot to fly route as planned, all UNICOM must be used.

Instructor to ensure planning sheet completed fully and FPL is filed.

## Mission 3 – Navigation

Location: KPSP (Palm Springs)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

Est. completion time: 1:30

### **MISSION BRIEFING**

Pilot to plan route from KPSP to L35 (Big Bear) and back to KNXP with <a href="https://www.plotaroute.com/routeplanner">www.plotaroute.com/routeplanner</a>.

Pilot to fly route as planned VFR, no aircraft nav aids permitted, all UNICOM must be used.

Instructor to ensure no FPL is filed, and that prior map planning is completed.

# Mission 4 – Flying Skills

Location: KNXP (Twentyninepalms)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

Est. completion time: 1:30

#### **MISSION BRIEFING**

Pilot to plan route to the north tip of the Salton Sea, to fly North-South over the lake at 100ft AGL. On completion, they are to return over the Joshua Tree National Park, at no more than 500ft AGL to avoid radar contact. During this leg, the pilot must perform evasive manoeuvres, with the instructor acting as an enemy aircraft. Landing as usual at KNXP. All UNICOM to be used.

Instructor to ensure altitude is <=100ft AGL for flyover and <=500ftAGL for return to station.

Instructor to act as enemy for final leg, put pilot in aggressive position to perform evasive manoeuvres.

### Mission 5 - Revision

Location: KNXP (Twentyninepalms)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

#### **MISSION BRIEFING**

For this sortie, the pilot is free to revise their flying, navigational, or planning skills for their final assessment as they wish so long as they spend at least 30 minutes doing so. The instructor is to ensure that the pilot practises some aspect of flying training. This sortie may be waived for exceptional performers.

Location: KNXP (Twentyninepalms)

Airframe: C208/TBM-930

### **INSTRUCTOR NOTES**

Assessment is mainly at the instructor's discretion, so long as **ALL** the criteria mentioned in the table overleaf is assessed. Flight origin and destination must be KNXP.
